conducting 130 short training courses, 4.365 participants were reached through 38 fellowships. More than 30 events were conducted as platforms for discussing emerging health and health-related issues and for sharing of new knowledge and information during the year. Needless to say, I look forward to hearing more about their achievements later on today.
