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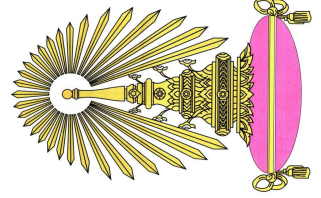

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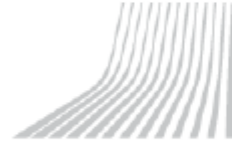

The main objective is to improve knowledge (What to know?) and skills (How to do?) of trainers who will be able to teach students in their respective Universities in the different areas involved in such investigation named: Applied Medical Entomology, Vector borne Parasitic and Viral Diseases, Ecology & Environment, Epidemiology, Data Management, Data Analysis and GIS.

This is a Training of Trainers programme with the objectives:

Previous recommendations/follow-up *

Relevance of the project

- The WP #1 "Preparation" identified the specific needs of the HEIs of Thailand in the management of the emerging diseases, provided an analysis of the institutional contexts in terms training programmes, and pointed out the gaps in knowledge and skills which may be addressed by the project.

Quality of the project design and implementation

- The training of trainers courses and their corresponding production (i.e.: videos integrating field record practice) will be integrated into existing study programmes at the different faculties concerned with two options: one is the creation of new (sometimes elective) teaching units, the other one is the enhancement of some existing teaching units.

- The minimum number of participants to for each training workshop is 15. The revised budget allows to

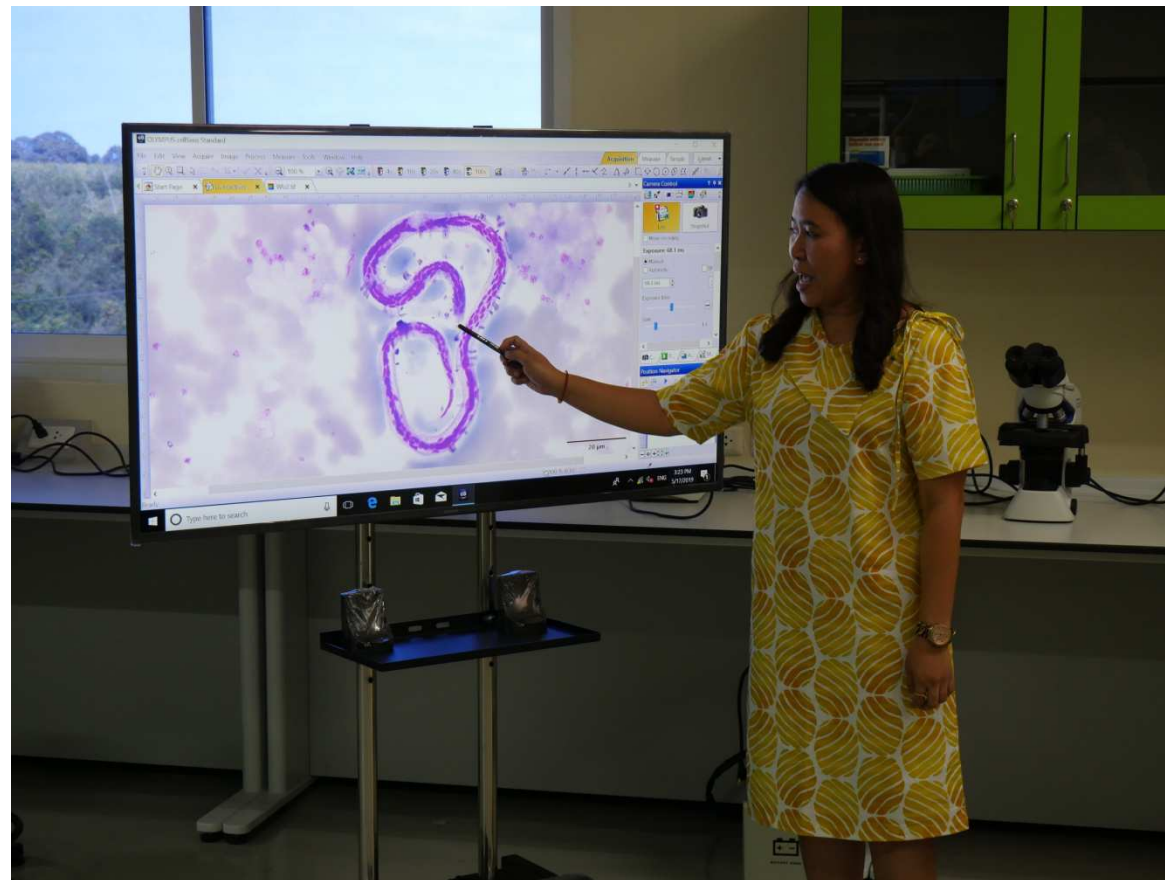

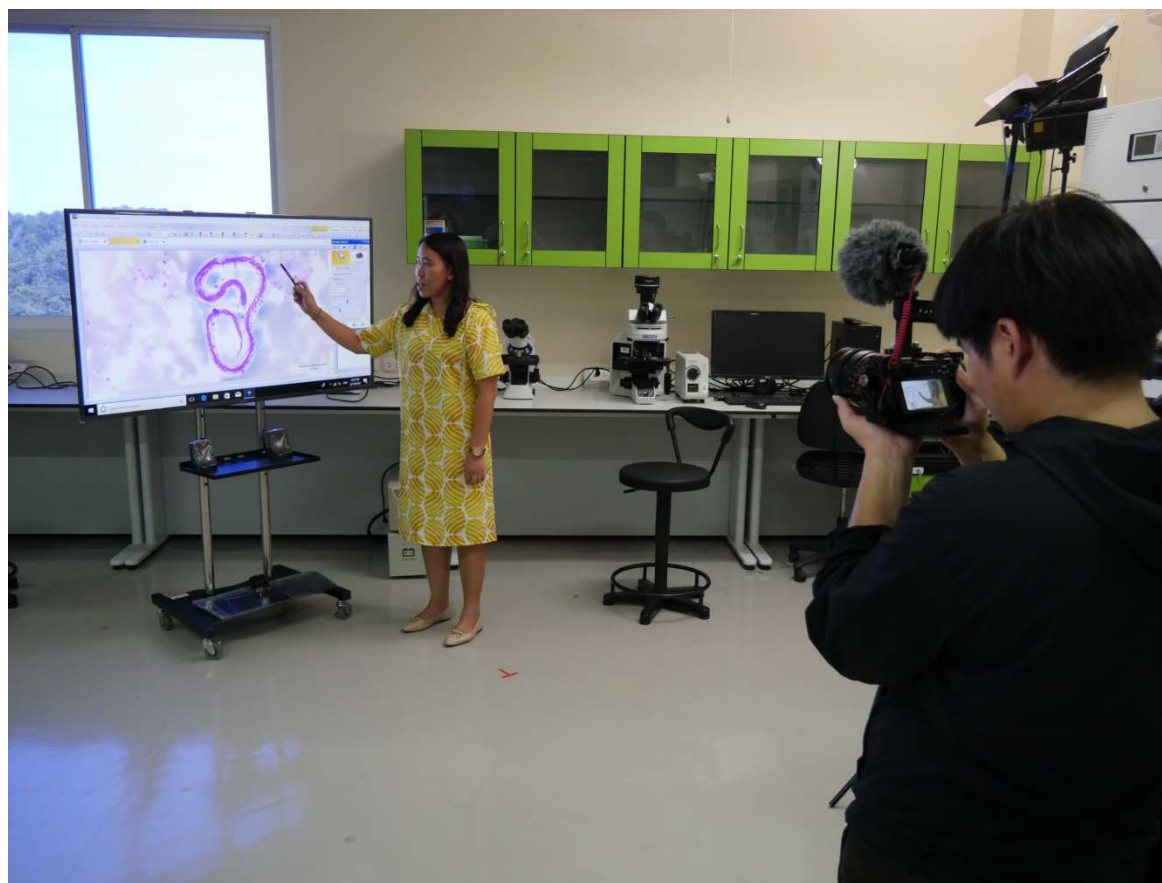
